



Ancient Empires Tunis, Malta, Sicily, & Sardinia aboard the Variety Voyager

he three Punic Wars, fought from 261 to 146
B.C. between the Roman Republic and the ancient sea power of Carthage, laid some of the crucial foundations in the development of Western civilization. During more than a century of conflict, a series of hard-fought battles occurred on land and sea, from Sicily to Africa, and the Romans ultimately prevailed to become the dominant political, military, and cultural influence in the region.

You are invited to join a fascinating seven-day cruise aboard the beautiful yacht *Variety Voyager* to explore ancient Roman, Punic, and Carthaginian sites in the western Mediterranean. See exquisite Roman mosaics in Tunis's Bardo Museum and, nearby, the remains of the great civilization of Carthage, an evocative UNESCO World Heritage site. Embark the *Variety Voyager* in Tunis and cruise to Malta, a strategic gem coveted by a succession of empires; the ancient Greek colony of Selinunte, the Carthaginian stronghold of Erice, and Segesta's beautiful Greek temple on Sicily; and the ancient ruins of Sulci, where the Carthaginian general Hannibal took refuge, on Sardinia.

Travelers will enjoy a series of lecture presentations and informal discussion during the cruise by archaeologist Rod McIntosh and classical scholar Denis Feeney.

Home / Tunis, Tunisia

Depart home on an overnight flight to Tunis. Upon arrival, transfer to the *Variety Voyager*. Enjoy a welcome reception and dinner on board this evening.

SUNDAY, JUNE 22

Tunis

View the stunning collection of exquisite ancient mosaics at the Bardo Museum, housed in a 13th-century palace. Then travel a short distance to the Punic and Roman ruins of Carthage, the ancient Phoenician empire that was the archrival of Rome in the second and third centuries. Completely destroyed during the Third Punic War, Carthage was later rebuilt to become one of the most important cities of the Roman Empire. Enjoy lunch in Sidi Bou Said, located atop a steep cliff with spectacular views of the Mediterranean. This beautiful little town, decked out in white houses with blue shutters and splashed everywhere with flowers, has for decades attracted artists and writers. VARIETY VOYAGER (B,L,D)



MONDAY, JUNE 23

Valletta, Malta

Valletta, thé capital of Malta and a UNESCO World Heritage site, was built by the Knights Hospitaller Order of St. John to defend against Ottoman invasions in the 16th century. The National Museum of Archaeology provides an introduction to Malta's prehistory and history and an overview of Malta's archaeological sites. Visit the village of Zurrieg's Punic Tower and, by special permission, the Tas-Silg archaeological site, which includes the Punic Temple of Astarte and Tas-Silg Temple. Tas-Silg spanned 4,000 years of history—from the Bronze Age to the Phoenician-Punic, Roman, Byzantine, and Arab eras—and served as a religious site for various different cultures.

TUESDAY, JUNE 24

Sicily (Selinunte)

Selinunte, an ancient Greek city on the southern coast of Sicily, was the focus of many clashes between the Carthaginians and the Greeks. Explore the archaeological site, which contains five temples centered on an acropolis; Only one of the five, the Temple of Hera, has been reconstructed. Enjoy an agroturismo lunch featuring locally grown food, learn how olive oil is produced, and taste local wines.

WEDNESDAY, JUNE 25

Sicily (Erice & Segesta)

Visit Erice, an exquisite medieval hilltop town encircled by Phoenician and Norman fortifications. A Carthaginian stronghold during the Punic Wars, Erice was also a significant location of religious rites honoring various goddesses of fertility. Equally compelling is the majestic Temple of Segesta. Dating from around 430 BC, the temple commands sweeping views of the surrounding valley, and its nearperfect state of preservation makes it one of the most important surviving Doric temples from antiquity.

THURSDAY, JUNE 26

At Sea / Sardinia (Sulci)

After a morning at sea, disembark in Sardinia to visit the ruins of the ancient Carthaginian city of Sulci, where the Carthaginian general Hannibal took refuge during the First Punic War. Among the ruins are a Punic necropolis and a Phoenician/Punic tophet, a type of sanctuary where the bodies of infants were laid to rest.

Tunis (pre-tour)

During a three-night extension in Tunis, travel to the ancient Roman city of Dougga, a World heritage Site with a rich history and exceptionally well preserved monuments. Also explore the alleys and covered passages of the medina in the center of Tunis, full of intense colors and lively trade. Overnight at the Mövenpick hotel Gammarth Tunis, a boutique hotel located in an exclusive resi- dential area overlooking the beautiful bays of the Mediterranean and the hills of Sidi Bou Said. Rome (post-tour)


Enjoy a two-night extension in Rome, with time to explore the Capitoline Museum complex on Capitoline hill and the Roman Forum, which for centuries was the teeming heart of ancient Rome and the center of public life, where processions and elections, public speeches and gladiatorial matches all took place. Rates: \$1,750 per person, double occupancy; \$700 single supplement.











VARIETY VOYAGER

The *Variety Voyager* is a state-of-the- art yacht that accommodates just 72 passengers in 36 cabins. Guests will enjoy her sleek lines and ample deck space, designed to the high standards of the finest privately owned yachts. Cabins and public areas are finished with warm fabrics, rich marbles, and luxurious wood paneling. Cabins have oversized portholes or double windows, en suite facilities with marble floors, individually controlled air-conditioning, TV/DVD, and access to 24-hour WiFi. Throughout the ship, guests have unobstructed views of the ocean and of the ports visited, as well as the services of a friendly and professional crew. There are opportunities to dine both inside the yacht and on the deck, and to enjoy the shaded sun deck lounge bar, the internet corner and library, and the mini-spa with massage room, sauna, hair salon, and fitness equipment.

What to Expect

We consider this a moderately strenuous program that is at times physically demanding and busy. Daily excursions involve up to two miles of walking at a time, often on uneven terrain. In some instances, elevators are unavailable and stairs may not have handrails. Participants must be physically fit, active, and in good health. Daytime temperatures in Sicily and Sardinia can climb into the upper 70s/low 80s F, with lows in the mid-60s and occasional rainfall. In Tunis at this time of year, the average daily temperature is 84F, with lows in the mid-60s and little rain.

Group Size

This program is limited to 63 participants, including travelers from the National Trust for Historic Preservation, Archaeological Institute of America, Princeton, and Yale.

Insurance

Travel insurance for trip cancellation and interruption, medical problems, baggage loss and delay, etc., is highly recommended, and we hope that you will obtain it for this expedition. Trip cancellation policies that apply to this expedition are included in this brochure. Please be sure to carry the details of your travel insurance coverage with you on the program. Travelers are free

to purchase the travel insurance of their choice. It is recommended that travelers clearly understand the difference between "primary" and "secondary" travel insurance.

Cancellations and Refunds

Deposits are refundable (less a \$250 per person administration fee) if written notice of cancellation is received within 30 days of reservation; after that, deposits are 100% nonrefundable. Final payment is due February 21, 2014 (120 days prior to departure). Cancellations within 120 days of departure are 100% nonrefundable. For this reason we strongly urge participants to purchase trip cancellation insurance. If the program is cancelled by the Criterion Travel, you will receive a full refund, without further obligation on our part. No refunds will be made for any part of this program on which you choose not to participate.
